<p>The teacher sat at a desk and asked students to complete various tasks.</p>	<p>Students sit at their desks and wait for instructions.</p> <p>Students take turns reading out loud their individual goals.</p> <p>Students eat breakfast.</p> <p>Students write down the various tasks that they must complete in class.</p>

Physical Development	Language and Literacy Development

Cognitive Development	Self-Concept, Identity, and Motivation
<p>The classroom walls are rich with content information (vocabulary and images)</p>	<p>Teacher uses calm and encouraging language.</p> <p>Students have individual goals</p> <p>There is one goal for the entire class</p>
Peer Relations and Moral Development	
<p>One student is instructed to select which students are to read out loud their goal.</p> <p>Students take turns in sharing classroom responsibilities.</p>
